

What you need to buy a Handgun

Must be at least 21 years of age to buy a handgun

Purchaser will need provide CA Driver's License or CA ID Card, Firearm Safety Card and Proof of Residency

If current address is not on id you must provide 2 proofs of California residency one must be issued from the State like valid vehicle registration, H6 form, interim drivers license, property tax or hunting license.
If current address is on id the 2nd proof can be CCW Permit, COE, C&R w/name and address, current DMV Disabled Placard, current DMV Registrations, current electriciy, gas, cable bill, hunting licensed, fishing license, signed, dated and notarized rental agreement. (bills **NOT** accepted are cell phone, directv or dish bill)

If current California Driver's License or California ID has "Federal Limits Apply" on it you will need to provide one of the following: **see other side**

- Valid, unexpired U.S. passport or passport card
- Valid, unexpired foreign passport with valid U.S. immigrant visa and approved Record of Arrival/Departure (I-94) form
- Certified copy of U.S. birth certificate
- Certified copy of birth certificate from a U.S. Territory
- Certification of Birth Abroad (FS-545)
- Certificate of Naturalization or U.S. Citizenship
- Certification of Report of Birth (DS-1350) or Consular Report of
- Valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card.
- Birth Abroad of a Citizen of the United States of America (FS240), issued by the U.S. Department of State

In addition, the gun you wish to purchase must be on California's list of approved firearms. <http://certguns.doj.ca.gov/>

What you need to buy a Long Gun

Must be at least 21 years of age to buy a handgun

Purchaser will need provide CA Driver's License or CA ID Card and Firearm Safety Card

If current address is not on id you must provide proof of California residency issued by the state like valid vehicle registration, H6 form, interim drivers license, hunting license or property tax.

If current California Driver's License or California ID has "Federal Limits Apply" on it you will need to provide one of the following:

- Valid, unexpired U.S. passport or passport card
- Valid, unexpired foreign passport with valid U.S. immigrant visa and approved Record of Arrival/Departure (I-94) form
- Certified copy of U.S. birth certificate
- Certified copy of birth certificate from a U.S. Territory
- Certification of Birth Abroad (FS-545)
- Certificate of Naturalization or U.S. Citizenship
- Certification of Report of Birth (DS-1350) or Consular Report of
- Valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card.
- Birth Abroad of a Citizen of the United States of America (FS240), issued by the U.S. Department of State

If the purchaser is not a U.S. Citizen, not a permanent resident then he or she is required to demonstrate that he or she is legally within the United States by providing documentation containing his/her Alien Registration Number or I-94 Number, plus 3 months utility bills and hunting license.

In addition, the gun you wish to purchase must be on California's compliant.

Firearm Safety Card can be purchased at our location for \$25, which consist of a 30 question test. Simply scan the qr code with your phone for study guide.



Under California Law: There is a 10-day waiting period before firearm can be released to a purchaser or transferee.

Upon Pick Up of All Firearms, You Will Be Required by California State Law To Have a CA Approved Gun Lock (applies to all transactions - buys, out of state transfers, private party transfer)

Handguns must be a California (dac approved) gun lock purchased within the last 30 days w/original receipt. (Penal Code 23635)

Long Guns / Firearm Frames
must be a California (dac approved) gun lock purchased within the last 30 days w/original receipt. (locking case, gun lock, trigger lock etc) (Penal Code 23635)

Gun Safess
must have: make, model, receipt and must fill out safe affidavit please review safe affidavit if going to be used - only valid for long guns / firearms frames. Must bring gun lock.

If current California Driver's License or California ID has "Federal Limits Apply" on it you will need to provide one of the following:



- Valid, unexpired U.S. passport or passport card
- Certified copy of U.S. birth certificate
- Certification of Birth Abroad (FS-545)
- Certification of Report of Birth (DS-1350) or Consular Report of Birth Abroad of a Citizen of the United States of America (FS240), issued by the U.S. Department of State
- Valid, unexpired foreign passport with valid U.S. immigrant visa and approved Record of Arrival/Departure (I-94) form
- Certified copy of birth certificate from a U.S. Territory
- Certificate of Naturalization or U.S. Citizenship
- Valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card.

Firearm Safety Certificate requirement exemptions

X01 = Special Weapons Permit Holder
 X02 = Operation of Law Representative
 X03 = Handgun being returned to the owner
 X13 = FFL collector with COE (*curio and relic handguns only*)
 X21 = Military - Active Duty
 X22 = Military - Reserve
 X25 = Military - Honorably Retired
 X31 = Peace Officer - California - Active
 X32 = Peace Officer - Federal - Active

X33 = Peace Officer - California - Honorably Retired
 X34 = Peace Officer - California - Reserve
 X35 = Peace Officer - Federal - Honorably Retired
 X41 = Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW) Permit Holder
 X81 = P.O.S.T. 832 PC (Firearms) Training
 X91 = Particular and Limited Authority Peace Officers
 X95 = Law Enforcement Service Gun to Family Member
 X98 = Valid Hunting License (*long guns only*)

Proof of Residency for Handgun Purchasers

- A. Utility bill from within the past three months that bears on its face the individual's name and either of the following:
1. The individual's current residential address as declared on the DROS form; or
 2. The individual's residential address as it appears on his or her California Driver License or California Identification Card, or change of address attachment thereto.
- "Utility bill" means a statement of charges for providing service to the individual's residence by either a physical connection (i.e., hard wired Internet, telephone connection or cable connection, or a water or gas pipeline connection) or a telemetric connection (i.e., satellite television or radio broadcast service) to a non-mobile, fixed antenna reception device.
- B. Residential lease that bears the individual's name and either of the following:
1. The individual's current residential address as declared on the DROS form; or
 2. The individual's address as it appears on his or her California Driver License or California Identification Card, or change of address attachment thereto.
- "Residential lease" means either of the following:
- a. A signed and dated contract by which the individual (tenant) agrees to pay a specified monetary sum or provide other consideration for the right to occupy an abode for a specified period of time; or
 - b. A signed and dated rental agreement by which the individual (tenant) agrees to pay a specified monetary sum or provide other consideration at fixed intervals for the right to occupy an abode.
- C. Property deed that bears the individual's name and either of the following:
1. The individual's current residential address as declared on the DROS form; or
 2. The individual's address as it appears on his or her California Driver License or California Identification Card, or change of address attachment thereto.
- "Property deed" means either of the following:
- a. A valid deed of trust for the individual's property of current residence that identifies the individual as a grantee of the trust; or
 - b. A valid Certificate of Title issued by a licensed title insurance company that identifies the individual as a title holder to his or her property of current residence.
- D. Current, government-issued license, permit, or registration, other than a California Driver License or California Identification Card, that has a specified expiration date or period of validity. The license, permit, or registration must bear the individual's name and either of the following:
1. The individual's current residential address as declared on the DROS form; or
 2. The individual's address as it appears on his or her California Driver License, California Identification Card, or change of address attachment thereto.

Examples of **acceptable** proof of residency:

- Carry Concealed Weapon (CCW) Permit.
- Certificate of Eligibility (COE.)
- Curio and Relic (C &R) Federal Firearms License (03 FFL) with name and address.
- Current DMV Disabled Placard.
- Current DMV Registrations.
- Electricity, gas, cable bill with purchaser's name on it from within the last 3 months.
- Resident Hunting License issued by Department of Fish and Wildlife
- Fishing License: Commercial, Resident Sport, Lifetime, 1, 2, and 10 day licenses issued by the Department of Fish and Wildlife.
- Signed, dated and notarized rental agreement/contract.

Examples of documents that are **NOT** acceptable proof of residency:

- Active Duty Military Spouse ID.
- Bank Statement.
- Brown Card.
- Cellular Phone bill.
- Fishing Validations and Report Cards.
- Hunting license- Standard, Self-Filled.
- Pay Stub.
- Voter Registration.
